

Journeying with TCM Participants

On 24 September 2022, the 5th batch participants for the Preparation for Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary (TCM) had their last session at Montfort Centre. Their nine-month journey culminated with a group sharing. The encouragement of the facilitators stirred the hearts of the participants and increased their desire to enroll in the Montfortian Gabrielite Associates (MGA).

As a facilitator for the TCM, my responsibilities were to ensure that all participants were engaged in the sharing and that they were able to confidently achieve the TCM outcomes. While doing group facilitation is not easy, it is possible if one is aware of the process and is alert, an open group sharing can be fruitful. This was achieved by first breaking the ice amongst the participants.

As it is important to acknowledge our feelings and to share our feelings with others, I created an environment where each participant feels encouraged to share their thoughts and opinions. To Jesus through Mary, we are all personally inspired on this journey and our relationships with one another have strengthened.

A participant shared:

“Ever since I decided to participate in the sessions that will lead to the Consecration to our Blessed Virgin Mary, I could feel and experience the closeness of our Blessed Mother Mary and her son, our Lord Jesus. The ‘zoom sessions’ were useful, and the sharing from our members helped us in our relationship with one another even though most of us have yet to meet each other personally. The sharing affirmed one another and made each of us realize that we are not alone. Personally, I find that through our personal sharing, our relationship with one another grew. The session on the ‘Knowledge of Mary’ was informative and insightful; and Bro Dominic’s sharing was inspiring and insightful. It was indeed beneficial”.

Metamorphosis

“What are you looking for?” John 1:29-42

Jesus asked this of the two disciples who followed him and they answered that He was the one Whom they sought. The generosity of God to those who seek Him is seen in His warm welcome and an invitation to His home.

The fifth run of the Montfortian Gabrielite Associate program looked at the various stages that one journeys through in search of Wisdom Incarnate. We arrived at a deeper understanding of the Montfortian way to Jesus through Mary.

Our 9-month preparation has been likened to the gestation period. The first trimester saw us recognising and renouncing the spirit of the world. The second trimester saw us being introduced to the secret whose name is Mary. The third trimester saw us being brought as disciples to Jesus through Mary. On the day of our consecration, we renewed our baptismal promises, in essence, being born again in Christ.

From the very beginning of the run, I struggled with placing Christ at the centre of my life, being distracted by work, study and the concerns of the family. This saw me being absent from a number of sessions and if this were to be treated the way the world sees things, I would have failed the programme. This personal experience of mine is a simple illustration that the way of the world is not the only way, and for me, I choose the way of Christ.

Picture my first entry into the cosy chapel at Montfort Centre. It was the evening of the first day of the retreat and stepping into the chapel's inner sanctum, I saw a life-size likeness of St Montfort in alabaster-white kneeling down and offering his heart to the cross. At this point in time, I did not know much about the life of this saint and did not understand the true significance of this gesture. I learnt about the man who put together a small group of good, poor priests to minister to the needy in France and the saint who was one of the greatest apostles of the rosary in his day and through his books and the Montfortian missionaries, he is still inspiring many today.

If there is a parallel to be drawn between the stages in our preparation for the renewal of our baptismal vows and the four main stages in life - birth, growth, maturity, death - it is that of transition and change. Transitions are inflection points and become metamorphosis, where we see rebirth and promise.

I'd like to end my reflection with St Montfort's prayer to the Blessed Virgin Mary, which also answers the question asked at the beginning, "What are you looking for?"

The only grace I ask of you, through pure mercy, is that every day and every moment of my life, I may say three times, "Amen".


An evaluation of the retreat was that they expressed a joy and fulfilment from the talks. They were also looking forward to participating in any overseas retreat.
